Message to Members

I am excited to welcome these new board members and look forward to starting 2025 with a strong board that I know will continue to serve and look out for the best interest of our agriculture community.

The beginning of December brought the annual Maryland State Farm Bureau Convention, held in Cambridge. As usual, Howard County was well

represented at the convention. Howard County Ag Ambassadors Natalie Davis and Kaitlyn Spicer both did a great job competing in the State Ag Ambassador Contest. Maura Cahill, Howie Feaga, Barbara Glenn, Katie Hereth and Rhonda Winkler, along with myself, served as delegates. We spent two days reviewing the Farm Bureau's policy manual. I would like to thank our delegates for taking time out of their busy schedules and spending a few days to help adopt and update policy, as well as review issues of concern for the upcoming year. It is always refreshing to spend time with like-minded people who have the same goals and understand the challenges we as farmers face along the way. I also appreciate that while we may still all have the same goals, that doesn't mean we are all going to take the same way to get there. I enjoy the opportunity to visit with others and hear their perspective on the industry.

While at the convention, Howard County was one of two counties to receive a Silver Bowl as part of the Awards of Excellence Program (Frederick County was the other Silver Bowl winner), recognizing achievement of top scores in all program areas. This program evaluates and recognizes each county farm bureau's activities in the areas of membership, leadership, government relations, fiduciary responsibility, outreach and outstanding county program. The success of our county farm bureau, and the award of this bowl, is a direct result of our board members and our membership. I would like to thank our board, as well as our secretary, Katie Hereth, for all the work they do to support agriculture in Howard County throughout the year. Great programs like Junior Showmanship (thanks Rhonda Winkler!), the Farmers Feed the Hungry Christmas Parade, and Agricultural Awareness Day (thanks Joe Dymek!) help to make our county stand out.

Speaking of standing out, Howard County was incredibly proud when our own Howie Feaga was recognized with the 2024 Distinguished Service to Farm Bureau Award! This award is given to one recipient each year in recognition of their outstanding service in the interest of Farm Bureau and agriculture. Howie has spent years working

tirelessly for the betterment of both Farm Bureau and our industry throughout our county and state. Whenever someone needs help, Howie is always one of the first to volunteer. I was so happy to be present at the convention to see Howie be honored with this very special award. Congratulations Howie!



A few short days after returning from convention, it was time to head over to Lisbon to enjoy the annual Great Lisbon Farmers Feed The Hungry Christmas Parade! It was a crisp, but sunny day, perfect for a parade. The street along downtown Lisbon was lined with spectators, while plenty of tractors and horses filled the parade route. While the final tally is not yet in, it looks like our local food banks – Howard County Food Bank, Carroll County Food Sunday, Farmers & Hunters Feeding the Hungry, and Lisbon Volunteer Fire Company will all reap the benefits of another successful parade. Thank you to the many hands that make this parade work, as well as to all those who attended and showed support for a fun and festive annual event.

As we turn the calendar to 2025, the start of a new legislative session in Annapolis is just days away. The 2025 Maryland General Assembly will convene January 8 through April 7 this year. Before the session has even started, there has already been some early hints at proposed legislation that could have potential impact on agriculture. To that end, MD Farm Bureau will sponsor its annual Day

in Annapolis on February 5. Following a morning legislative briefing, this is a great time to speak with our representatives in Annapolis about issues that are important to the farm community and our businesses. 2024 Distinguished Service to Farm Bureau Award



Ever since he started milking cows as a teenager, Howie Feaga has been a lifelong advocate for Maryland agriculture. Howie owns and operates Merry Acres Farm, a horse boarding, hay, and beef farm in Ellicott City. He was born and raised on the farm and bought the family milking herd over time and operated as the dairy owner for 22 years. In 1997, Howie started boarding horses with a 6-stall barn, and in 1998, he built a larger 18-stall barn and ended the dairy operation. The farm's main focus turned to horse boarding while continuing to farm the land. In 2004, he started construction on the arena barn with 21 stalls and began to fill it in the Spring of 2005. Their

pastures are 7-8 acres each, with 6-7 horses per pasture. Howie makes close to 170 acres of hay annually and grows a small amount of wheat and corn, along with selling "Merry Acres Beef". His farm has been recognized for its sustainable agricultural practices, winning the county's Soil Conservation District Cooperator of the Year Award in 1998 and 2011, as well as recognition from USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service.

Howie served on the "Board of Directors" for Maryland State Farm Bureau for 6 years and he served as the President of The Howard County Farm Bureau for 12 years. He also served as an out-going President Board Member in the 2020 year. During his time as President, Howie was instrumental in establishing The Great Lisbon Farmers Feed the Hungry Christmas Parade. which has raised nearly \$200,000 for hunger related charities in Maryland. The parade is currently in its 14th year and continues to be sponsored by the Howard County Farm Bureau to benefit the Howard County Food Bank, Carroll County Food Sunday, Farmers and Hunters Feeding the Hungry, and the Lisbon Volunteer Fire Company. Another program Howie helped to establish and promote through the Howard County Farm Bureau, is the Junior Showmanship Program. This program is currently in its 10th year and offers hands-on experiences through summer workshops on farms with swine, diary heifers, lambs, and goats to children ages 5-9. The first Saturday of the Howard County Fair, the children participate in the Junior Showmanship Contest to have a real experience showing animals in the show ring. This program continues to promote future 4-H and FFA members, along with educating the next generation about agriculture. Howie continues to serve on the Board of Directors for HCFB, is serving as District 2 Maryland Farm Bureau Director for Howard, Carroll and Montgomery Counties, and continues to volunteer as chair or participate on numerous Howard County Farm Bureau committees such as policy development, nominating committee, and membership.

We are thrilled to name Howie as the recipient of the 2024 Distinguished Service to Farm Bureau Award!

Air View Farm Donates Books on Agriculture to HoCo Elementary Schools



Agriculture Literacy Week happens every year in March. The purpose is to help children increase their awareness of agriculture, farming, and where their food comes from. This year, members of Howard County Farm Bureau read the Agriculture Book of the Year, "Farm Boots', from the Maryland Agricultural Education Foundation (MAEF) to students at Bushy Park Elementary School and Lisbon Elementary School.

We are thrilled to share that Merhlyn Barnes of Air View Farm in Woodbine, and long-time member of HCFB, recently donated copies of two agriculture books to all 40+ elementary schools in Howard County. Merhlyn tells the story that in 2013 she wanted to help kids learn more about agriculture. So she ordered copies of the MAEF Book of the Year, "Seed Sun and Soil" and another book, "Corn." Farming and family events got busy and the boxes were buried in the farm office. But when HCFB came by, Merhlyn passed on the books to us for donating. Success! Even after 10 years, these books will now be

distributed to all 40+ elementary schools in Howard County.

Thank you Merhlyn for your lasting impact on kids who will love learning more about agriculture. She and her husband, Bill, have been members of HCFB for decades; Merhlyn served as chair of the Women's Leadership Committee; and was secretary to the board for 35 years. Howard County Drought Relief Grants:

Howard County is providing grants to Howard County Farmers in response to the recent heat and drought conditions in 2024. This extreme weather has negatively affected our farmers.

These grants are administered and awarded by the Howard County Economic Development Authority (HCEDA) in cooperation with the Howard County Office of Agriculture.

Applicants can receive a primary grant up to \$5,000 for losses they incurred due to the extreme weather in 2024. Primary grants are awarded on a rolling basis and will be accepted until **January 30,2025**.

An additional secondary grant will be awarded as funds allow for farm operations with losses greater than \$5,000. The Secondary Grant is a separate application and must be turned in by **February 15, 2025**.

Farm Operations applying for the grants will not receive more than a total of \$30,000 in drought relief grants (Primary Grant \$5,000, Secondary Grant \$25,000)

All grants will be awarded at the discretion of the Howard County Economic Development Authority and the HCEDA may request additional information or documentation to verify losses.

Howard County Enhanced Agricultural Grants:

Howard County has a grant funding opportunity with a mission to preserve and support agriculture in Howard County. These grants can be used for programing, research, and/or capital investments provided the grants facilitate the expansion, sustainability, and/or education of Howard County Agriculture and administered by the Howard County Economic Development Authority in cooperation with the Howard County Office of Agriculture.

Grant applications will be accepted until **February 28th**, **2025** and applicants can receive grants up to \$250,000, however there is a total of \$500,000 of grant funding to be awarded and typically this is spread out among several applicants in values ranging from \$20,000 to \$70,000. Grants will be awarded by the end of March 2025.


Maryland Agricultural Education Foundation Announces 2025 Ag Literacy Week
